This School Support Document should be signed by an official college/university faculty or staff member that is connected to a campus program, club, or academic department who agrees to work with the Ambassador pair over the 2023-2024 academic school year. The role of the campus program/club/ department is fundamental to the success of the program and the campus program/club/department should assist with all associated outdoor outings throughout the program time frame.

Program Information

National Park Trust is looking for pairs of student ambassadors to lead initiatives on their college campuses that increase outdoor recreation, awareness, and stewardship within their campus community.

As a student ambassador, leveraging school assets and school/community connections, you will be tasked with the following:

- **Programming:** Developing and implementing outdoor activities throughout the Fall 2023 Spring 2024 school year.
- **Community Building:** Cultivating inclusive and healthy culture around the outdoors amongst your peers on campus and online via social media.

Application Deadline: May 19, 2023

Successful Ambassador Pairs:

- Are currently enrolled at a U.S.-based college/university.
- Have a passion for the outdoors, wellness, and community building.
- · Excited by the idea of building an online community.
- Have a relationship with a school program, club, advisor, or academic department and can leverage assets and infrastructure (i.e., gear, transportation, marketing) to support outdoor experiences.



Application Requirements

Proposals must include details on the following activities:

- 1. One visit to a local park that raises the park's profile with the campus community. (Don't worry! There are resources to help make this possible!)
- 2. One stewardship-focused outing that gets members of the campus community outside and actively participating in park stewardship.
- 3. One fishing-themed outing at a national park service site.
- 4. One Collaborative outing where you partner with a non-outdoor club and plan a social experience. Ex: A Poetry slam, a picnic, or a hike.
- 5. Submit a 2-minute video (shot vertically) introducing yourself and the school you represent. We want to hear why you believe getting students outdoors is important- and what excites you the most about this opportunity. This video will be your official ambassador welcoming video online so let your personality shine; speak to your peers and us!
- 6. Each ambassador pair must have the written support from a school program, club, or academic department endorsing you as their representative and agreeing to work with you on organizing and implementing ambassador outdoor outings. Download the School Support Document here. You will be asked to upload this document with a signature in the application.

Ambassador and School Resources

Resources include:

- A \$1,000 stipend for each ambassador AND \$2,500 for each college/university to support ambassador outings throughout the academic year.
- Each school will receive a fishing gear bank for 15 people (poles and tackleboxes) to be used for the ambassador fishing outing. The school will keep the fishing gear for future school related outdoor activities.
- Each ambassador will receive a National Park Trust Ambassador t-shirt, a backpack and water bottle from Hydro Flask, National Park Trust swag, and more.
- Each ambassador pair will receive swag and materials for tabling events and outreach.
- Each ambassador pair will receive an Ambassador Communications Toolkit that will help with outreach and creating and implementing social media campaigns.

The College Ambassador Program will also offer career exposure and employment opportunities within the park and outdoor industries.

June 2023 - Notifications sent to applicants

September - October 2023 - Ambassador onboarding and planning

October 2023 - May 2024 - Outings and ongoing social media campaigns

December 2023 - Ambassador mid-year check-in

May 2024 - Ambassador final report due
