AMBASSADOR PROGRAM DETAILS

- ***Responses for all questions must be under 2000 characters max.
 - Ambassador Local Park Outing: Describe the local park outing that you, the ambassador pair, will help plan and promote along with your school program/club? What local park will you visit, and what activities are you planning to do while there? Outing locations can be approved school grounds, a Hipcamp property, or any local public outdoor space, including parks, forests, and public waters. **Activity must include a camping component**
 - Ambassador Stewardship Outing: Describe the stewardship-focused outing that you, the ambassador pair, will help plan and promote along with your school program/club? What outdoor space will you visit, and what stewardship activities will occur?
 - Ambassador Outdoor Recreation-Focused Outing: Describe the outdoor recreation focused outing that you, the ambassador pair, will help plan and promote along with your school program/club/department? Where will this outing take place, and what activities are you planning to do while there?
 - Make sure this outing will take place at a national park service or US Forest Service site.
 Each school will receive a 15-person gear bank.

- Ambassador Rails-to-Trails Outing: Describe the rail trail outing that you will help plan and promote along with your school program/club/department. Where will this outing take place?
- Ambassador Collaborative Outing: Describe an outing that you will help plan and promote as a collaborative, inclusive community event for your campus. Where will this outing take place? What activities are you planning to do while there?
 - This event should be low-key and outdoors in partnership with another club/ group on campus. For example, partnering with the step squad for bird watching, poetry slam in the park, visiting a national heritage site, bike, and brunch, or yoga on the quad. It's completely up to you. Feel free to get creative, but make sure it's feasible.
- **Gear Bank Plan:** What is your plan for how your school will store, maintain, and use the awarded 15-person gear bank?
- Overall Ambassador Outreach Plan: Engaging a diverse range of people in the outdoors is important to the National Park Trust and this program. Please describe how you will use social media and other forms of outreach to get your campus community excited about the outdoors and the park outings you are planning as part of your ambassadorship.
- Campus Ambassador School Support Document (UPLOAD FILE): Each ambassador pair
 must have written support from a school program, club, or academic department endorsing
 you as their representative and agreeing to work with you on being a successful Park Trust
 College Ambassador. The role of the campus program/club/department is fundamental to the
 success of the program and the campus program/club/department should assist with all
 associated outdoor outings throughout the program time frame. Provide this form to your school
 contact, ask them to sign, and then YOU upload it with your application. Download the Letter of

- Ambassador Pair Commitment (checkbox): Each ambassador pair must agree and commit to implementing all tasks identified in this program. There is a time commitment that will be required to be successful, so each ambassador must have time in their schedules this upcoming academic year to be able to plan and implement outdoor outings and activities with your school program, club, or department, create social media content, and communicate with and report back to the National Park Trust. Each ambassador must be in good academic standing with their university and have at least one campus faculty as an adviser for the year of programming.

• Ambassador Pair Application Video (PROVIDE LINK): Submit a 2-minute video (shot vertically AND outdoors) introducing yourself, which HBCU you represent, and your major. We want to hear why you believe getting HBCU students outdoors is important- and what excites you the most about this opportunity. This video will be your official ambassador welcoming video online so let your personality shine; speak to your peers and us! Provide the link to the video. If you cannot record a video together as a pair, no worries; please record separate videos and provide the additional link.
