Please read the below information about the FY23 Challenge Cost Share (CCS) Program and sign the statement of approval on page 2 of this document.

**CCS Project Themes:** Selected projects will strengthen conservation and outdoor recreation on NPS administered National Parks, National Trails System, and Wild and Scenic Rivers in one or more of the following ways:

- Addressing the Climate Crisis. Projects that address the climate crisis and builds
  resiliency to a changing climate. Projects could include developing green infrastructure,
  nature-based solutions, and/or creating sustainable energy sources.
- Conservation Projects (Lands and Waters). Projects that increase the acres of protected or restored lands and waters.
- Advancing Equity for Youth from Underserved Communities. Projects that increase equitable access to parks for youth and young adults from underserved communities.
- **Outdoor Recreation.** Projects that increase public access to new and restored outdoor recreation opportunities.

Eligibility and Administration: Eligibility extends to NPS-administered Parks, National Trails, and Wild and Scenic Rivers (including Partnership Wild and Scenic Rivers). All projects should be collaborative partnerships between NPS staff and a partnering nonprofit or educational institution. NPS staff should submit the application. If approved, the identified nonprofit partner or educational institution will act as the fiscal manager of this award and will become the main contact for this request.

**Qualifying Criteria:** Every application must meet these Qualifying Criteria before further consideration:

- 1. **Supports National Park Service Responsibilities** The project must benefit one or more national park, National Trail, and/or Wild and Scenic River.
- 2. **Collaboration and Cost-Sharing** The project must be financially supported, equally, by NPS and partner(s). The partner(s) must commit to providing a total match equivalent to the level of CCS funding received. This match can consist of in-kind goods and services as well as cash from non-federal sources.
- 3. **Maximum Financial Support** \$25,000 is the maximum amount of CCS funding provided per project.
- 4. **Timing** The proposed project should be substantially complete within 10-12 months from the date that CCS funds are disbursed. Funds should be expensed, or have a plan for expense, by the end of the NPS FY.
- 5. **No NPS Salaries** CCS support may not be used for any ONPS staff salaries.

- 5. **Build public stewardship** The project builds new stewardship opportunities for the public.
